

JOINT CRITERIA FOR INCLUSION ON JUDGES LISTS
(This criteria has been adopted by all seven UK Border Terrier Breed Clubs)

A1 JUDGES LIST

Persons who have been approved by the Kennel Club to award Challenge Certificates in the Breed, and who have the support of the Club.

A2 JUDGES LIST

Indicates persons who fulfill, all the requirements for the A3 List and have been assessed in accordance with Kennel Club requirements for inclusion on an A2 List and have the support of the Club

A3 JUDGES LIST

Persons who the Club would support as being suitable to award Challenge Certificates in the Breed but are not yet approved by the Kennel Club for inclusion on the A2 List.

Criteria to be considered for inclusion on the A3 List

Specialist Judges

To have the support of the Club and have:

- Been active in Border Terriers for a minimum of 10 years
- A minimum of seven years' experience of judging the breed
- Judged at least one Breed Club Show and/or two Breed Club Supported Entry Shows at each of which at least forty Border Terriers were entered and present
- Judged at least the number of Border Terriers in breed classes as currently required by the Kennel Club for the stud book band allocated to the breed (Band D – 160 dogs as at 2015) over an adequate geographic spread of venues
- Attended at least two Border Terrier Breed Specific Seminars run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice
- Attended a Seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Requirements of a Dog Show Judge
- Attended a Seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement
- Attended a Seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on the points, structure and conventional measurements of the Dog
- Passed an examination or assessment if applicable
- Submitted an application/questionnaire if requested to do so
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press
- Been an owner or breeder of at least three Border Terriers when these dogs obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances)
- To have stewarded over a minimum of twelve days at Shows at either Limited, Open or Championship level.

Non-Specialist Judges

To have the support of the Club and have:

- A minimum of five years experience of judging the breed
- Judged at least one Breed Club Show and/or two Breed Club Supported Entry Shows at each of which at least forty Border Terriers were entered and present
- Judged at least the number of Border Terriers in breed classes as currently required by the Kennel Club for the stud book band allocated to the breed (Band D – 160 dogs as at 2015) over an adequate geographic spread of venues
- Attended at least one Border Terrier Breed Specific Seminar run in accordance with the relevant Kennel Club Code of Best Practice
- Passed a Border Terrier breed examination or assessment if applicable
- Submitted an application/questionnaire if requested to do so
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press
- Been an owner or breeder of at least three dogs of any breed when these dogs obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances)
- Been approved to award Challenge Certificates. to at least one other breed and have done so on at least three occasions

B JUDGES LIST

Indicates persons who have been approved by the Club to judge the breed at Open Shows or at Championship Shows without Challenge Certificates

Criteria to be considered for inclusion on the B List

Specialist Judges

To have the support of the Club and have:

- Been active in Border Terriers for a minimum of 5 years
- A minimum of two years' experience of judging the breed
- Judged at least thirty Border Terriers in breed classes
- Attended at least one Seminar on the Border Terrier Breed Standard
- Attended a Seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on Kennel Club Requirements of a Dog Show Judge
- Attended a Seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer on Conformation and Movement
- Attended a Seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on the points, structure and conventional measurements of the Dog
- Stewarded on at least two occasions at Limited, Open or Championship level
- Submitted an application/questionnaire if requested to do so
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press

Non-Specialist Judges

To have the support of the Club and have:

- A minimum of five years experience of judging any other breed
- Judged at least thirty Border Terriers in breed classes
- Attended at least one Seminar on the Border Terrier Breed Standard
- Been placed and currently remain on the A or B List of a breed Club for at least one other breed
- Submitted an application/questionnaire if requested to do so
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press

C JUDGES LIST

Persons included on the C List are aspirant judges who do not fall into any of the previous categories and who have completed the Club's approved questionnaire.

Criteria to be considered for inclusion on the C List

Specialist Judges

To have the support of the Club and have:

- Been active in Border Terriers for at least three years
- Submitted an application/questionnaire if requested to do so
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press

Non-Specialist Judges

To have the support of the Club and have:

- A minimum of three years experience of judging any other breed
- Been placed and currently remain on the A, B or C List of a breed club for at least one other breed
- Judged at least twelve Border Terriers in Breed Classes
- Submitted an application/questionnaire if requested to do so
- Undertaken to write show critiques as customarily requested by the weekly dog press
